



## 2022 - City of Whiting Scholarship

### **About the Scholarship**

The City of Whiting Scholarship was instituted in 2009 as the result of a partnership among elected Whiting officials, the BP Foundation, the Whiting Community Improvement Fund, Lake Park Development, and the Whiting-Robertsdale Community Improvement Corporation. The Scholarship is funded through private donations and donations from the City of Whiting. The BP Whiting Refinery and the Family of Ron Plewniak continue to contribute annually to the fund.

The Scholarship is open to graduating high school seniors who are the legal dependents of residents who own and occupy a home in Whiting.

Original awards were for \$2,000 per school year. Beginning with the scholarships granted in 2011, the City of Whiting Scholarship was increased to a \$10,000 award, with \$2,500 being disbursed to the recipient each August for four consecutive years. For scholarships granted in 2014, the City of Whiting Scholarship was increased to a \$12,000 award with \$3,000 being disbursed to the recipient each August for four consecutive years. For the 2015 scholarship award, the amount was increased to a \$16,000 award, with \$4,000 being disbursed to the recipient each August for four consecutive years. For 2016 award, the amount was increased a \$20,000 award, with \$5,000 being disbursed to the recipient each August for four consecutive years. In 2018 and 2019, the award was increased to a \$25,000 award, with \$6,250 being awarded each August for four consecutive years. The 2022 award will also be \$6,250 per year with a four (4) year total award of \$25,000. A 1099 tax form may be issued by the college or university if the combined total of all financial assistance received by the student exceeds the IRS threshold. For the 2022 Scholarship, up to four (4) scholarships may be awarded (including the Plewniak Engineering scholarship described below).

For the 2022 graduates, a restricted scholarship opportunity has been established by the family of Ron Plewniak. The Ronald F. Plewniak Scholarship has been endowed for an eligible applicant who is pursuing an engineering degree. Ron grew up in Whiting and is forever tied to the city's history as "the little boy who lost his leg" in the Standard Oil explosion of 1955. Despite this experience, Ron Graduated from Whiting High School in 1965 and then obtained an Electrical Engineering degree from Purdue University, West Lafayette. He worked his entire career at Inland Steel and was highly respected as the go-to guy to solve complex problems. The goal of Ron and his family with this scholarship is to help an engineering student get traction to lead a productive life.

### **Scholarship Conditions**

To maintain eligibility, students must demonstrate that they are classified by the institution they attend as full-time and must maintain a 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) GPA. Students are required to submit their grades to the City of Whiting Clerk-Treasurer's Office at the end of each academic year and are to openly communicate any changes in their scholastic involvement. If a student fails to meet any of the outlined conditions, the Scholarship may be terminated at the discretion of the Committee. The Committee may also consider

exemptions to these conditions if extraordinary circumstances warrant it. Winners of the Ronald F. Plewniak Scholarship must also remain in the School of Engineering for the entire four years of the award.

### Qualifications

To be considered for the City of Whiting Scholarship, applicants must:

- Have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0
- Sign a publicity release form
- Be the dependent of a Whiting homeowner who occupies that home
- Attend a regionally accredited institution of higher learning

### Selection Criteria

Each Spring, the Mayor of the City of Whiting will convene an *ad hoc* committee consisting of the Mayor or his/her designee, a member of the Board of Directors of the Community Improvement Corporation, a representative of BP and two members of the academic community. No member of this committee may have a family member applying for the scholarship at the time. This committee, who may request to interview applicants, will determine scholarship winners based on the following criteria:

- 1/3 Scholastic Achievement (GPA, SAT/ACT score, class rank, awards, etc.)
- 1/3 Involvement & Leadership activities within the school
- 1/3 Involvement & Leadership within the community
